You then want to run the MADi card and ADI648 at 48k and sample rate convert from 48k to 96k using the 8DDs?

I also use the latency compensator.
Putting an waves rvox I type 64 and all faderworks go up to 64.
Putting a rchannel from waves on snare it needs a 65 , so I type 65 and all

others go up just one sample to 65 !!
