Well, interestingly enough, the C-16 was the easiest thing to deal with. (Simplisitically, you just open up a serial port and send and receive information. Of course, convincing your application to know what to do with that information is something completely different...) There's a second serial port you use for controlling the other hardware - routing signals to the MEC ports, etc. I never did finish reverse engineering the EDS effects subsystem...
