I'm playing back a 31 track project with a 98% UAD-1 resource load with the buffers set to 512k (6ms). No crackling in the audio.....at all.....and no dropouts or glitching. System isn't even breathing hard.

This is with my system marginally optimized for audio. None of the recommended registry tweaks have been done and none of the system service tweaks have been done either.
