+4 is the **\*\*0VU\*\*** setting on pro gear.. which can be anything from -21 dB to -9dBFS depending on who makes the gear.

The idea is to set whatever you feed Paris with to 0VU (console, pre's etc) then adjust the input trims to \*your desired\* level for 0VU. Here, we used the full output level of a DA88 to determine the input cal for our cards (at the time, we transfered in a LOT from DA88/38)

Basically, you want the head-end stuff to be operating at an optimum level without the Paris inputs clipping.
