The downside a director-friend of mine noted with the MOTU unit is that it uses DVCPro for compressed HD (instead of Apple's ProRes for example), which isn't really a video mastering quality format. Jamie might have more thoughts on it.

Certainly looks cool though. ;-) One thing MOTU does really well - they cover a lot of I/O options. I'm impressed they've made a move into video with what appears to be a rather extensive I/O unit.
