Add some reverb to the third keyboard (small amount) that comes in, the triangle, the timpani and snare drums. I think that alone will breath a bunch of life into it.

Pull the timpanis up at the end so they crescendo up.

Pan the triangle to one side and if you have anything else like the triangle, pan it to the other side.

Post your changes if you decide to make any. This is really nice.
