I'm not knocking technology or new gear, not in the least. I'm just surprised that _other_ people are using such modern guitar gear as the PARIS community seems, um, how do I say this, more on the traditional side than most.

I've thought about a Variax, actually, but not so much for the different sounds but so I can store tunings.
