Well after several email's and phone calls - 17 bands got whittled down to eight and with special guests we've got another three or four covered.

The rehearsals started in mid October and ran two three times a week right up to this Thursday evening and went surprisingly well. In fact the guitarist and keyboardist of one band hadn't touched their gear in over twenty years and that band is doing material by Kansas, Frank Zappa and some Santana. They apparently started rehearsals on the side back in July and have been woodshedding because they were prepared!

Load in is at 1:00 pm and the theme for the day is "it's under control....controlled mayhem that is"

The game plan is to take an 18 channel feed from the board (Midas Venice) into a friends Nuendo rig as well as a stereo feed to a broadcast quality digital video camera (static on the stage) and then catch different stage angles with three mini dvd recorders along with one roaming 8mm video

camera.
