I also can understand the thinking that having preprocessed tracks can definitely save a bunch of time. the new BFD (and actually one of the older BFD add-ons) has these preprocessed tracks.

One of the things I hated about BFD was it's user interface. It just sucked, IMHO. After going out and trying EZ Drummer and Addictive Drums, these pretty much left BFD in the dust. As I posted the other day, using EZ player with BFD as the sound source did help things a bit as far as the interface goes.

I just ran across this video of the BFD 2 which is going to come out around mid November, most likely.

This looks like what I've been waiting for. It can use my existing unprocessed BFD sample set plus it's going to have 55GB of new samples many of which are preprocessed and ready to go. It's got it's own onboard mixer and the individual tracks can be sent out to VST tracks in Cubase for further processing on channel inserts.

I was talking to Morgan about this yesterday and he's having a seminar on this up at ECCM as soon as they release the program to their distributors. When I was using an HDSP 9652, I could use the Mytek as clock master. The MADI card will not accept the Mytek as clock master so I have to slave the Mytek to the MADI. This works fine but due to the large number of devices I have to also slave, I need to take an AES feed off the Mytek into my Lucid GenX-6 and then clock everything else from a simultaneous feed from the Mytek WC output and the GenX-6 that is being synced to the Mytek so the Mytek is still the central clearinghouse for the rest of the clock signal. So the current clocking is as follows:

This all works perfectly at 44.1 KHz but it goes to crap at 88.2 because the Mytek doesn't like to be slaved to the MADI at higher sample rates. The Mytek worked fine as master clock to or slaved from the HDSP 9652, but not with the MADI. It also works fine slaving to a GenX-6 so I'll likely have the following WC chain:

As I said, the Mytek locks up perfectly to a Lucid because the clock is set before the computer boots up but if the Mytek is problematic slaving/and regenerating WC signal for any reason, I've got enough BNC outs on both Lucid boxes to just slave the GenX-6 to the GenX-96 and get the Mytek out of the loop as a distro device. I doubt I'll have problems with this

so you see.....as with my Paris rig, I've managed to simplify things again with the new RME rig.

Steve L.It probably does. Computer gear (save hard drives) can usually go through a washer and come out OK. The most important thing to do is let everything dry COMPLETELY before turning it on. Take all of the external metal you can off of the MEC so the boards can dry out. Pull the MEC cards (carefully) so the contacts can dry out. Then lay everything out and point a fan at it and let it blow for a day or two, turning everything over to be sure it's dry. (I've used a blow dryer before but that can heat things up too much if you're not careful). After that I'd try turning on the MEC only and seeing if anything works. Then add one card at a time. You might get lucky, or you might not. But if you start firing the stuff up when it's wet you're cooked.

Additionally, I've got 4 more external processors here (a POD XP Pro (96KHz capable), a second Sony V77, a TC Electronics D-2 and a TC Electronics M2000) patched into the AES 32 I/O #'s 9 thru 16 with the Sony and the two

TC devices interfacing with 6 x Behringer Ultramatch Pro units in a similar manner to what I am using with the ADI 8-Dd units and these are handling the real time sample rate conversion to/from 88.2KHZ for these boxes. yes, Asio is nice, but it seems that folks are hell bent on cracking .003 ms latency at 88.2/96k sampling rates or even 192.

Even with the fastest computers, they all struggle to get to utopia zero latency.. Jsut add any mixer and the problem is solved..

BTW: Those Apogee symphony test are real world numbers. You gotta admit, thosse ms nuembers are impressive..

And, although kind of expensive, those current macs can be used as dsp devices..aka like farm dsp cards..
