First, be sure it's using a correct driver, for the most it's an Asio kind of things. Often, when using these kind of programs for first time, there is a calibrating set that will take care of the computer/audiocard speed etc. automatic. It's setting up buffers, latency etc, to take care of problems like these you mentioned here. But if Sonar have this kind of things, I don't know at all. It can be an idea to look here if the manual is too hard to go to:
