The above question is key at this moment, but there may be a few other questions as the process continues:

1. Will authorization be required via the Internet? If so, at what point and where do I go for it?
2. If Paris 1.55 and 1.8 have to be installed prior to Paris 3.0, I unfortunately have them only in floppy form. (I never obtained the CD version.) This means I'll have to copy the data on the original floppies to my old G3 which has a floppy drive and copy them to a CD(s) that I can then load into the G4. Since the original 1.55 version came on two copies,
