When booting Paris this message occurs:

"A plugin was requested that appears to be unavailable.
Perhaps you uninstalled? The plugin is UAD Pultec-Pro
and Pultec-Pro(m). We recommend if you removed the plugin
from your vst plugins folder, you replace it and run VST Config again."

I have rerun VST config but it never changes the situation. Pultec-Pro is in the VST folder and I reran the UAD 4.3.exe. Pultec Pro shows in the wrapper with a Y next to it like some of the others. Cambridge EQ works fine but not Pultec Pro and they were installed at the same time.

What else can I do? Uninstall UAD 4.3 from add remove programs and try again?
