Dimitrios, I'm not sure I understand exactly what your suggesting here. Correct me if I'm wrong. Anyone else want to chime in?

1. Choose compressor in say Aux 1.
2. Set Aux 1 in all the drum tracks to Pre Fader.
3. Send the return(s) of Aux 1 to an unused track(s), depending on mono or stereo or,
4. Patch the signal, with cables, physically out of the 8 out card and back into a free audio track(s)
5. Eq and automate your compressed drum tracks in the new track(s)

Do I have it right?
