Note that Spinaudio is free for one plugin so you can wrap only Chainer ...

If you don't have chainer and don't wanna mess with all that stuff here is a workaround.

On track 1 (kick) you put senderella1wrapped from Spinaudiofree. On track 2 senderella 1 again , both tracks as sends with desired amount of volume. On tracks 15 and 16 you put as stereo file the Spinaudiowrapped Senderella1 as return and then on second Paris slot as stereo the free FFX4 (DX chainer)

This gives again the 4096 sample latency for UAD plugins and you load there your UAD reverb

Thus you have the above again situation.
