the cables. Right now the two-footers are bringing clock
data into their units at a third of the timing that the six-
footers are... the resistance difference adds a whole 'nuther
factor, too but even if that were the same, you've got the
units on the receiving end of the six-footers clocking sample
number "1", while the ones at the end of the two-footers are
already at sample number 14,700 (@ 44.1k samplerate).

Are you basically hearing like 3 clicks/pops per second,
roughly?

Get all 6-foot, 75-ohm cables & report back, do not under any
circumstances use 58/59-ohm cables (in my experience, anyway).
