design is very different from those. It uses large high power transistors instead of the small low powered types. I think modern construction techniques used for making them helps eliminate many of the problems associated with germanium transistors.

Sound wise I would compare it to the Neve 1057 type modules. The earliest "prototype" Neve that used germaniums. The big differences being much higher voltage and headroom with better frequency response and noise. The key to the sound on the germanium is the controls. Especially feedback and thick. you can actually vary the feedback of the amplifier and change how it functions and sound while doing so. In this months Tape Op there is a review where he says the feedback one direction sounds more open and "faster" like and API and the other more gooey and thick like a Neve. Combine that with the thick, pad, and input gain and you have a good selection of tones...Check out the review if you can...
