My UAD-1 card that I purchased in 2003 went South last week, disappearing from the UAD Meter config (though it still showed up in Apple System Profiler). I called tech support, described the problem, and asked what I could do. They told me the card needed to be replaced.

How much? Nothing. No cost.

I picked up a new one from the Canadian Distributor here in Toronto today and installed it, re-authorized the plugins (plus got a few new extra ones 'cause the card is a newer configuration)and away
