You just use SUBMIX mode if I'm correct. In total mix you pick submix and from there each of the top two rows (hardware input) and (computer input) can have any of their tracks routed to ANY of the 24 outputs plus spdif. When in this mode, each time you click on the outputs of any of the first two rows you will get a list of ALL outputs that you can route each channel to with check marks to indicate which are being sent.

I think you then open the matrix with "x" and you can see / change all the routings there too.
