>One thing to be aware of is that it will clip internally if the gain staging
>isn't done right. If the preamp gain is +20 dB, the Main out gain must be

>-20 dB or lower. I could have enforced this in the UI, but it would have
>been a lot of coding that really shouldn't be necessary.

>first port of code written for the DP Pro, and there were some really critical
>differences that took a lot of time to figure out. My next task is porting

where I have gain matched and compared the outputs of a 16 ch sum with no eq
no effects and I can pick the mixes every time.
When I sum in paris I may do a little bit of extra EQ - probably just to
account for the bass lump.
I just add the Lexicon back in at this point rather than EDS FX.
However I wouldn't be shy about using a chorus or whatever over a group if I
needed it within Paris
