>I can confirm much of what Deej says here, though of course we don't know  
for sure how apples to apples the comparison is. I've been using the Claytor  
mostly as a room mic for the drum kit but also on some other things where  
I'm doing scratch tracks of guitars or something. It's not hyped at all,  
not bright and not dark, but it has a little gravitas to it that kind of  
sneaks up on you. It's not easily noticed until you try a different mic on  
the same source.

It's pretty ecumenical about preamps as well, I've used it with everything  
we have, from the built in pres on the Firebox to my Langevin.

It will be interesting to see if we use it for vocals. So far we've been  
using the Baby Bottle for demos but I think when it comes time to actually

track I'll try the Claytor and the Bottle on each of us and see what works best. We have three male vocalists and if I had to handicap it I'd say I'll go through the bottle (I have the lowest speaking voice and usually sing a part under the lead vocal), Russell will use the Bottle (very loud, full voice), and Nick will use the Claytor (much thinner, higher voice than the rest of us). But it will be interesting to see.

DCThat sounds like a great setup, Bill.

I have a friend who uses a Tonelab through a Bose L1 system for prog and fusion stuff and he gets excellent tone and response even without a tube power amp or guitar speaker. So that's possible, too.

I haven't tried the Tonelab myself but I'm impressed with what he gets out of it.

For my gigs the GNX4 fills multiple roles: I use it as a guitar preamp, guitar/violin multi-FX box, mic preamp, vocal/instrument mixer, direct box and live multitracker. It does all that. Kim can probably relate (he uses one also).

I run my GNX4 direct to the house PA via the balanced XLR output and it sounds consistently great out front (I can go mono or stereo).

I monitor onstage using the house monitoring system, or through an EV 12" 2 way PA speaker/monitor that I bring, or if I want to travel light, through a Galaxy powered hot spot on a mic stand at Guitar height (for easy controlled feedback) - aimed at my ears (lets me keep stage volume down but I can still make the guitar sing). In all cases, I can keep stage volume under control and there's no "spotlight" of loud guitar hitting any part of the audience from the stack I don't use. :^) So the house engineer really has total control of the mix and the mix is consistent throughout the FOH.

If there's no house PA (small gigs) I can throw the EV on a pole and cover the house, or even add its twin and make everyone go deaf with guitar crunching goodness.

The key for going direct to the PA with the GNX4 and getting great tone is to turn on the internal speaker emulation, and to program the patches while listening through a full range system (I use my studio monitors).

Because I also run my violin, my vocals (the GNX4 has a mic preamp), my guitar synth and sometimes my keyboard through the GNX4, I actually require full range monitoring rather than just a guitar speaker. However when I'm just playing guitar at a band gig, I could probably get away with using a non-full-range guitar speaker. But since the GNX4 sings just fine without it I haven't felt compelled to haul my 2x12 cab to gigs. For my particular setup it's just not needed.

However 2x12 sounds great with my heavily modded bassman 50 head! But that rig no longer has to take the abuse of gigging.

You can't 'play the console' with this kind of structure like you can with a mixer that has limited headroom at the faders (like Paris and its integer based buss). What you see as a limitation, I see as an advantage, and vice versa...

What you lose with the high headroom 2-buss is variation in clip point...a high headroom 2-buss will only clip at one spot, where you've set the master fader to. It's nice to be able to clip a channel using the EQ trim, then run the fader down a bit, using the trim/clip as a bit of a limiter/level control. This means that all your tracks clip at different points relating to their fader settings, which is harder to perceive as clipping per-se since it sounds more musical in a mix. To do this on a floating pt system you'd need to add a saturation pluggin.

I also agree that we don't want to create a monster in the process. Would a public system automatically be a monster? It depends on how it's structured.

We already have a monster. We know that the current non-public system does not measure up. Again, due to how it's structured.

Moore uses the examples of fire departments and police departments as public entities that work. It's a fair point, government operated services can work reasonably well, so I wouldn't rule that out entirely. OTOH, there are other approaches that could also work, involving creating a framework within which a mix of public and private enterprise could operate.

Any change should be set up to take advantage of scale to keep costs down.

Competition within a system can also keep costs down so if there are opportunities to create competitive incentives in the system that would be well worth considering.

At the same time, we shouldn't lose focus on the bottom line, which in this case is not just cost, but health and life. Balanced, somehow, with cost.

We can't pretend this is an easy problem. We can't pretend any solution will be immediately perfect. But it's worth trying to envision something better than the current mess.

On the bright side almost all parties in the current system have incentive to work toward something better, because it's not working all that well for most parties involved: employers, employees, doctors, hospitals, government.

On a related tangent, I don't think health plans should be provided by and tied to businesses/employers. They should be completely portable and unrelated to where you work IMO.

Turns out he LOVES the live kick & snare sounds we got - we ended up not even using the triggered sounds on those. So anyway, it's a D-6 through a Chandler TG-2, and I had picked up an Earthworks Kick-pad recently, so I stuck that on the kick mic, too, since we had the kick all stuffed with towels & such up against the head to prevent it from double-triggering on the rebound... I figured I'd see if the kickpad might help give me some tone right off the bat & it worked out OK. From there it was just my usual Multiband comp/No EQ settings for the kick.

It doesn't suck, but its not anywhere close to the hype, regardless of who is saying it (and how much they are compensated for saying it)...

From what I heard, the biggest advantage is that these Toft boards are .... new.

IMO, \$5-\$6K will buy an awful lot more quality, character, and sonic mojo than the Tofts...but that's just one opinion.

Oh - and the reason it took so long to get the board released: (this direct from Alan Hyatt himself) was the continual quality control issues, manufacturing snags, parts availability in China, suppliers flaking, last minute design changes (some major ones), mass shipping plans that fell through, etc...

Lots of advice from other people. Here's a few observations/opinions.

- If a mastering guy is using converters as limiters, that's a disturbing admission of rank incompetence.

- I wouldn't say for sure than an opto compressor can't work here. Depending on the dynamics of the song the compressor can be 'always on,' compressing

a little bit all the time. That changes the slew rate when it goes from say 1 db of gain reduction to 4-5.

- Do you have a UAD-1 card? You might try two of their opto comps/limiters in series. The first one getting you most of the gain reduction and the second one only hitting the peaks.

- Or you could try an opto plug-in followed by a straight digital limiter, Dynasone from Prosoniq (the greatest mastering tool you've never used) has various options for this, and sounds excellent. The PSP 'Vintage Warmter' (the most offensively named plug in you've never used that still sounds really great) has a limiter mode that might work for this.

- If you want to go the hardware route, I bet you'd find that renting a (well maintained) two track tape deck would get you what you want more than a fancy tube comp/limiter. As SSC once said, roughly, 'The great thing about tape is how easy it is. Once the record head starts to glow, you're pretty much there.'

That's all I can think of now. Good luck, and whenever I write this stuff I'm really happy I work in genres where dynamics are still allowed.

The bottom line of all this is to reduce jitter as much as possible at all stages of the recording process. Jitter creates a lot of the \*digital harshness\* and midrange/low end flabbiness/wierdness that everyone complains about. To that end, as far as Paris is concerned, an external clock source makes quite an improvement. I tried to use the Paris D/A's to mix and was going crazy trying to nail the mid frequencies. I finally took my mix down to Catcusfire's studio in Taos (remember Andy?) and played it back through a Cranesong HEDD and discovered that there was nothing wrong with the mids, it was the D/A converters I was using (Paris on Paris clock). Not long afterwards, MikeClaytor came to Durango and brought a Benchmark DAC-1 and we patched it into a mix and the difference was very obvious. Not long after that I got a Lucid GenX 6 and clocked my entire system to it. The A/D and D/A conversion (D/A's that I was using for processors on inserts) improved as well and the system, overall, exhibited more clarity, depth /better imaging. I would strongly recommend an external clock for any Paris user.

As far as Cubase goes, I'm clocking my RME hardware to the BNC output of a Mytek Stereo A/D. I think the RME hardware reclocks everything it sees to it's own internal clock, but I'm not sure exactly how they do this. At any rate, I am happy with whqat I'm getting from the 24 RME AD/DA's I've got here whether they are being clocked by the Mytek or whether the Mytek clock is being reclocked to the RME clock. I am still monitoring everyghing from the Benchmark DAC-1 and if I was recording to tape or something like a Masterlink, I'd be using the DAC-1 outputs to send the 2bus to the recorder and monitoring off the playback heads if it was an analog deck and making final mix decisions based on what the tape was telling me. As far as digital goes, I would not be making final tweak decisions by monitoring off the D/A's of the mix deck because I could be certain that whatever the DAC-1 was feeding the digital recorder would be what I'd (supposedly) end up with as the final product and the digital deck's D/A's probably wouldn't be up to the level of the DAC-1's D/A converters.

I usually leave the masterfader at dead-on zero & stick some kind of brickwall across the 2-buss (usually Izotope Ozone - that way you can use their MBIT+ or Psych5 dither at the same time), and in my case -6 seems to be a good place to start all tracks. I have a template set up for that, and often the vocals end up higher & sometimes the kick & snare, too; but most everything else ends up lower... IOW, -6 for what I'm doing seems to be a good starting point for individual channels; maybe -10 for you as a starting point is the way to go. It matters not too much, I think, as long as you're not overstuffing the mix buss with too many overhot levels going into it or wasting bitstream resolution potential by having too many low levels going in either.
