Always burn a little slower than max, and so far Imation and TDK blanks have never let me down.

thru compressors, I'd say this: I frequently (but not always) track vocals,
bass, guitars and horns thru compressors, usually dbx 160X for vocs, UREI
LA-4's for guitars and bass (although the 160X is nice for them too) and horns,

then RNC (I have 3 of 'em). I never track drums thru compressors! Nor do I
ever gate drums. I would always rather have the un-compressed drum tracks
first, then compress as needed after. In fact, I frequently don't compress
drums, even in the mix...
