When I put a 442 (without the housesync in paris cfg) then I don't get the ins/outs of 442 to work.

When I put the housesync then I get 442 ins/outs to work but mec2 ins outs don't work.

I clock mec1 from ADIPRO8, mec2 from mec1 and 442 from external wordclock that slaves to adipro8.

I don't want to have 442 in A card because then I cannot have 24bit spdif output for monitoring...
