 to an RME card slaved to incoming ADAT timecode from Paris... Worked

okay for a while -- and this was on an 800Mhz Athlon with maybe 256 RAM... I'm sure you could work something out -- you'll need an extra soundcard in there, obviously... I mean, something other than Paris. Then you pipe the output back to your MEC in whatever form --S'Pdif, adat, analogue, whatever -- for monitoring in Paris. I never tried this on one computer under XP, by the way. Probably would be at least as good or better. My set-up now is Paris on 98SE sending ADAT sync to another computer running Cubase SX3 (under XP, of course)... Works okay for my needs these days.

Short answer is -- yes. (but the long answer is at least... longer...)
