>I agree. To go through a PA, which is usually not the best sound quality,
128k is probably enough. For personal listening I usually use 192 or 256,
but on a PA 128 would do, assuming your encoder is good.

That said there is the occasional audio file with odd phase stuff going on
which doesn't convert well.

Also, if your PA is mono, a mono MP3 at the same bitrate will likely improve
quality.
