AAThe 1820 is a good sounding card esp. for the money. The drivers may not be quite in league with RME and Lynx, but I installed a couple in A/V media systems and never had a problem for that use. They would do quite well with a \$500+ 8-channel ADDA unit using those converters.

If you are looking for a DAW alternative to Paris, there are quite a few great options.

I wouldn't trash Emu just because Paris couldn't survive. Emu didn't really have the money or resources to run with Paris anyway - I am guessing Creative just said "okay, give it a try, but if it doesn't make money

instead of costing money, it's done."

I have an Emu Audity 2000 - great rack synth. I have no intention of selling it. Emu may not be running wild with cutting edge soft-synth and hardware synth technology, but they do what they do, and it is a niche for them.

Officially the XP drivers and effects subsystem are only supported on version 3.0. That said they do work on 2.2 also. I have used them myself for a good year or more on XP.

HOWEVER, one trick in loading the effects subsystem on version 2.2. The effects subsystem (minimum setup.exe) tends to automatically default to the path for Paris 3 (which is like \Program Files\EMU\Paris Pro\). You need to change this to the correct path for your system. Not only that, but there's a quirk from memory where after you set the path it will then modify it by adding \Paris Pro to the end of whatever path you enter or something like that. You need to watch very very carefully when setting the path for minimum setup.

That's the first idea that comes to mind. Hope this helps.
