PCI slots, and in hindsight (not being able to use but 2), I might have looked at something else. Imho, if you aren't all PCIe at this point, it's

a bit of a crap shoot trying to get a great board. The Asus boards do seem to get mixed reviews, but most PCI boards I looked at did as well.

The P5W is running well for guys with firewire audio (FF800) and 2 UAD-1s.

I get some glitches with graphic movement at certain latencies (e.g.

dragging the timeline in the Nuendo arrange window during playback), but

it's inconsistent and hasn't been a showstopper (I have a PCIe XFX GeForce dual head DVI). I wouldn't call it a great board, but I think this is a bit

of a transition period with boards.

I also haven't upgraded BIOS, but it's a later rev anyway.
