into high end networking I think, and become a network architect for someone like CISCO or NORTEL - they get stupid money. And it is artistic - you design and see the future of the business client and stroke the brush on how they'll expand and use it. The art is today's design with the future in mind.

Some insights: *everything* is going to be about networks in the future where business is concerned. Video Security, visual entertainment, audio/audio control, data, phones, fire alarms, smoke detectors, remote users.... it's all network capable these days. With the advances in storage, CPU power and 10Gbit network speeds here today, it will only get bigger and the cool thing is that the fiber in the ground is still good as speeds push upwards for some time. IMO that means switches/fiber equipment is gonna be the demand, and labor on how to design it/implement it.

OS and computer type are a fading memory, it's all gonna be about (wired and wireless) internet/intranet. Believe me on this. Take that CLWMC or GC gig if you need to but study at night. If it's about networking, learn the 7 OSI layers, understand the IP / Subnet mask relationship, learn the ins and outs for secured network structure especially in the wireless field.
