Thanks for the support! I took a look at the eventiter code, and it already assumes 44.1 for its calculations, so unless you're working at 48k, a sample rate fix won't help the sound.

Does it get grainy just at high input volumes? I could probably add a input gain knob, if it doesn't already have one. I bought a copy of it back in the day, but I don't use that type of effect much, so I'm not that familiar with it.

I've been hacking DSP code regularly these days, but I still can't read most of it. I doubt I'd be able to improve the algorithm itself (at least not until I can figure out more of the ESP assembler syntax).

Let me know what you think.
