Hi All,

I figured I'd post a work in progress in case anyone finds it useful. It's the pcomp with a mix knob. Dimitrios helped set me on the right track about some design decision and took the time to try it for a while to make sure it wasn't broken in some horrible way.

The mix knob blends in direct signal, and the comp. gain knob raises the volume of the compressed signal in order to make up the gain, while leaving the direct signal unaffected.

When I get some time, I'll do the mono version and try to add the same thing to the two versions of NoLimit.

KerrHey there Rod - No I don't have any of the UAD stuff, but I was really referring to plugins in general - I wasn't aware that the UAD stuff is apparently even more sensitive than the norm when it comes to overloads. Have you tried sticking a simple gain plugin either in front of, or in back of (depending on where the overload is coming from) that Neve Comp & THEN try dialing in the amount of coloration you want, then readjust your gain levels to just below where the clipping comes back in? That might be all it needs... Here are a couple free ones:
