First, they sold us a vinyl copy of the album, which we happily paid for.

Then, they re-issued it as a half-speed master, either MFSL, Nautilus, or CBS's own flavor.

And then they expected us to pony up MORE \$\$\$ for another copy of what we already owned.

And some people, for whatever reason, bought either 8-track or cassette copies of the album, buying ONCE AGAIN a copy of what they already owned, for the same price as they originally paid.
