You should really read the science.

Unless you have a predisposition to either distrust science or believe things are fine, in which case you can ally yourself with a very few dissenting scientists (there are always a few in the minority on any subject), a cadre of special interest PR folks working diligently to extend Exxon profits, truth be damned, and a novelist.

But you'll be hard pressed to find solid peer-reviewed science to back them up. It's largely speculative, even desperate rationalizations amplified by special interest money that use repetition and talk radio to sound credible but are not. It's a house of cards built on unpublished and unsupported theories, roundly debunked by mainstream science based on facts on the ground and in the atmosphere.

A better path is to acknowledge the trumped up "controversy" for what it is, but then listen to what scientists in multiple fields have actually published in peer-reviewed journals. See how the evidence lines up. And

draw your conclusions from there.
