I'll be watching with interest - the marketing manager was over on Gearslutz saying that he thought it was likely it'd have video support soon. If someone would come up w/ a DAW that could open projects created by other DAW's that'd be a pretty exciting development. Is the code used in Pro Tools, for example, so proprietary that no other program can open a PT session w/ all edits and inserts intact? Ok, sorry to seem so lame on this, but a little better understanding of how this works would be helpful. Especially for us that still have Paris equipment, but moved to other systems.
