I've not pressure-tested it with anything much larger than about twenty
tracks. It will get a bigger workout as time goes on.

I was thinking of starting work on a library of presets for the DP4
Hall, Vocal Plate and Drum Plate soon, using whatever rough
equivalents I have access to as a starting point - things like Logic or
REAPER presets for example. I don't have a DP4 or DPPro to analyze and

steal presets from - you wouldn't by any chance happen to have any conveniently packaged info on the original DP4/DPPro presets you could send when you had a minute, would you?

> I'm fighting like hell to get the PSCL working reliably, but alas, it isn't
> yet.
>
> I just found a bunch of really sketchy code to write to registers on the
> EDS cards - I'm fixing it up, but it will take time. it seems like the more
> I dig, the more unsafe code I find. And once I fix it, I find out it isn't
> the unsafe code that was causing the main problem.
>
> The latest is that the driver randomly refuses to process interrupts - the
> app loads, but no audio passes beyond the first buffer sent to the card,
> and the C16 doesn't work. I thought this was a startup issue, but it can
> happen at any time while using the app. It's major mystery, and I may have
> to look at the scherzo driver to fix it.
>
> The best way (thought it doesn't seem to work on my quad core Phenom) is
> to use the original PSCL with the two pieces of software that I've posted
> to this message to lock the scherzo drivers and the paris app to the highest
> CPU.
>
> I would love for someone to test out my pscl just to see if it works on their
> setup. If it works perfectly, then we can compare configs to help narrow
> down where the bug is. This, of course, takes time, and I understand that
> people are busy.
>
> To answer the PSCL question directly, the PSCL with no file extension is
> the original one that ships with PARIS for windows 98. The XP minimum setup
> takes the ".dll" off the end and writes the updated version in the folder.
> Only the file with .dll at the end matters. The other one is ignored.
>
> I'm not getting blue screens, but I have occasionally had "could not read
> memory" errors from two threads trying to open the debug log at the same
> time. You may need to restart the machine after copying the file. Windows
> may cache the original version, despite replacing the file on the disk.
>
> I hope this helps. I'm working really hard to track down the cause of the

> main bug. It took me 3 weeks just to find any sign of code running differently
> when the app doesn't work right. The PSCL is huge and very complex.
>
> To give you an example, I realized that about a third of the attempts to
> write to EDS registers were failing under the old code. I've got it down
> to about 2%, and I think those are registers that are updated by the card,
> because those registers always read back different no matter what I do..then
> I found out that "instruments" are being loaded into the EDS registers the
> same way. So, I need to create a new lock and implement it in a way that
> won;t cause deadlocks. It just takes time.
>
> I hope this helps, Wayne. I'm working really, really hard on this!
