I have now received the Alps K series motorized faders - I decided to not use the N model faders that are apparently in the Euphonix surfaces. The K series is much higher quality - there are two rails that the fader slides on - I can see why they are rated at 10x the lifespan! (But 2.5x the price.) Also, the K series is very high performance - it only takes a small pulse to make it travel the full 100mm. (Good problem to have I figure...) I'm upgrading to a faster processor to handle that. In the meantime, I have touch sensors working and am converting fader movement to control messages. For initial testing, I'm leveraging my existing code that only outputs MIDI, but once the basic system is stable, I'll start interacting directly with the EDS card.
