>I was thinking that maybe the reason /INTAFFINITY isn't working is that
the
>Paris application is getting loaded on the 1st CPU, whereas /INTAFFINITY
>is sending the interrupts to the second CPU, hence you still get the issues.
>I'm thinking that maybe, just maybe, if you can set the Paris application
>to use the second CPU as well, that perhaps having the Paris app plus the
>interrupts going to one CPU might fix it.

The "gotcha" that I have discovered is that the RME HDSP inputs will not digitally lock to an incoming signal that is crosspatched from a different Digipatch unit. It works normally on signals from devices on the same Digipatch patch unit though. It's strange because the RME HDSP output works fine sending signals crosspatched to devices on other Digipatch units.

Anyway, this situation is rocking along nicely now. I'm gonna have to get a 4th EDS card and another ADAT module to finish this beast.

>genel have had some interesting results by applying affinity parameters using task manager. I was able to get Paris to work for quite some time while making a lot of changes using the C16 and the mouse. Usually that would lock things up. Also, I was able to get Waves to work in Samplitude using this tool. Unfortunately, I seem to have to use task manager to set affinity each time I open the programs. I will investigate the info given on the sybase web site about using imagecfg.exe.

HOWEVER - I attempted to set affinity using the microsoft tool kit called intfltr.exe on the Paris MIDI driver that was listed using this program. This is the same program I unsuccessfully used to try to set affinity on the Scherzo driver. Since that time, I have not been able to open Paris at all. It's beginning to look like I will have to re-install Paris to get things working again.

There are three reasons why I jump through all of these hoops when I'm = mixing

1. To bypass the restricted Paris submix architecture of paris for = hardware processors
2. To use VST plugins on Paris inserts and auxes
3. To enable me to keep using the Paris mix bus (which is by far the = most important of all, to me)

Sooo....to that end, I though I'd try to simplify a few things for those = of you who might want to try this:

Using Cubase SX as a standalone processor for applying VST plugins to =

Paris tracks (requires powerful computer)

Make sure both systems are using a common clock.

In the Control Panel of your native audio interface, set the latency to = 1.5ms.

Physically patch the Paris ADAT I/O to the ADAT I/O of the audio device = you are using with Cubase SX. Check the control panel of you audio = hardware and make sure the I/O are sync'ed up.

Set up a matrix in the Paris patchbay where you are sending and = returning whatever tracks you want to process via ADAT on the insert = module. Do it for tracks on all Paris submixes if you have multiple MECS = using multiple ADAT modules and have enough corresponding ADAT I/O on = your native system.. This is how you bypass the restricted Paris submix = architecture.

Set the insert on the Paris mixer channel you want to process to = external.

In Cubase, create a corresponding number of audio tracks.

In Cubase > VST connections>create mono input and output busses that = correspond to the ADAT I/O of your audio interface that is connected to = the Paris ADAT I/O

Insert the VST processor you want to use on the audio track in Cubase

Click on the little "speaker" icon on the Cubase audio channel so you = are monitoring with effects.

Hit the Play button on Paris. The audio will be processed though the = plugins on the individual tracks in Cubase Sx and returned to Paris.=20

The plugin delay compensation works very well at 1.5ms under this = scenario, allowing you to play back tracks in Paris that aren't being = processed in Cubase with tracks that are.

Watch your channel levels in Paris. In an insert send/return scenario, a = hot track being sent from Paris can clip the bejeezus out of a UAD-1 = plugin in Cubase SX so be careful. This takes some finesse.

There is another scenario which I use in which I import all of the = tracks into Cubase SX and then just return them to Paris while being = processed on both systems. The digital matrix for individual tracks only = requires the patching of ADAT outs on the native system to ADAT ins on = Paris and then Paris is set to "Live Mix" mode.

Due to the necessity of rendering, then batch processing the audio files = to .wav over a network, then importing them to a cubase mix template, = this takes more time to set up, but once you get your head around it, = I'd say it adds about 15 to 30 minutes *per song* to your session time = but if you enjoy the Cubase editing capabilities, and the Paris mix bus = this is definitely the way to go.

Now.....how about getting those cool VST FX (can you say convolution = reverbs?) and VST delays on some Paris auxes????.....well.....here's = how:

Mono and stereo VST effects in Cubase FX on Paris auxes

1. Physically patch a pair the I/O of the audio interface you are using = with Cubase to a pair of Paris I/O
 2. Route these Paris I/O to an aux in the Paris patchbay and assign this = aux to a record enabled track in Paris.
 3. In Cubase > VST connections>make sure the I/O of the card being used = with Cubase are set up as mono or stereo input and outputs
 4. In Cubase > VST connections>Group/FX>Add/FX and choose the effect you = want on that FX channel
- (at this point, if you want the effect centerpanned, you can just use it = as a send effect on a Cubase mono or stereo audio track)
5. In Cubase > VST connections>Group/FX>Add/Group
 6. In the Cubase project window go to the Group Channel, rename it with = the name of the Paris aux it is using and assign it to the mono or = stereo bus that is connected to the Paris aux.
 6. In the Cubase project window go to the FX channel and insert the = effect you chose in Add/FX on this channel and then choose the same = output bus for this channel that you chose for the Group Channel so that = this effect goes to the Paris aux
 7. On the mono or stereo track in Cubase insert this effect as a send = effect.
 8. Make sure the channel faders for the audio channel, the FX channel = and the Group channel are set to unity.

9. Start playback and make the necessary adjustments in the send levels = on the Cubase audio channel and the Paris aux channel.

In order use a hardware processor across submixes in Paris.....

1. Physically patch a pair the I/O of the hardware interface with the = I/O of an audio interface you are using with Cubase.
2. In Cubase > VST connections> create an external effect and assign the = I/O of the audio device that you are using with Cubase SX
3. In Cubase > VST connections>Group/FX>Add/FX and choose the external = effect that you created.
4. If you want centerpanned mono or stereo, at this point you can just = use this as a send effect on a mono or stereo audio track or for = panned auxes in Paris, you can follow steps 5 through 9 above.

I realized my post probably may not have made sense at the start - I was referring to how it is interesting that we've come to the same result with completely different perspectives and experiences, and therein perhaps lies the answer to why DAWs seem different.

When it all comes down, every app or mixing medium requires a slightly different approach, but more often that is about workflow - not summing or other dsp anomalies (which is one thing developers of digital audio try to avoid). As engineers and producers we all look at problems and solutions differently (which is what makes this a fun and creative business), but with digital audio, the results can easily be the same when those differences are fully understood. That sometimes requires throwing out tradition or learned approach and figuring out what actually makes up the result we are trying to achieve. That isn't always as elusive as it once seemed.

To finally summarize a bit of my conclusion on our running conversation on this, I've been comparing DAWs to find the differences for quite a few years now. The key isn't trying to push any digital DAW, but finding the tools that equate to what needs to be achieved. I can create the same result in Sequoia and Nuendo. Only workflow changes.

As we all know, once you find a way to create a sound, it is no longer a mystery relegated to a particular piece of gear. Regardless of what platform a mix is done in, it ends up on CD with the same bit depth, sample rate, stereo field, etc. The human techniques of mixing are really what it make the most difference. Certainly different tools (Eqs, comps, limiters, pres, mics, consoles, etc) all sound different, and will be better choices for different styles or different needs. But, there isn't a "magic bullet" - just understanding.

If you insist on paying for an inferior Microsoft operating system, as an alternative to Norton I suggest AntiVir or Clamwin. AntiVir is free as in beer, Clamwin free as in beer and free as in speech (it's GPL'd). The downside is that Clamwin doesn't include a real time scanner--you have to tell it to scan something. I think the XP firewall is pretty decent, I use it on my machines but I also have my own firewall built into my home router. I think Zonealarm mostly just scares people.

But try Ubuntu, after a little bit of kicking around you'll be thrilled you did.
