>> CAT5e 'might'. Depends on cable quality and length, I've seen it go both

>> ways. I still wouldn't do this route if you like data integrity.

>> Your physical limit is 310 ft of CAT6. I don't go past 300 ft, on

>> principle of hating failures/sketchy quality. We use Belden where I work,

>> it seems to be just fine. Avoid wierdo off brands, those I've had trouble

>> with.. especially the jacket. Nothin' will piss you off like pulling a

>> 250ft run and finding out if kinked 'somewhere' in the middle of it and
