1. Just send all of your tracks to a big analogue console and squash and mix them there just like you would with a tape recorder.

2. Send the tracks out the Paris inserts to an analog mixer, compress them there, then return the two track to a pair of Paris inputs.

3. Build a second single card Paris system and network the two systems. Install a Steinberg Midex on the system that you want to be a slave. Set the slave system with the Midex to slave to smpte and send a smpte audio track from the master system to the Midex on the slave system. Either send the drum tracks to the slave system or all of the other tracks to the slave system and keep the drum tracks on the master system, then use NoLimit or another stereo comp across the Global bus of whichever system (master or slave) has the drum tracks and route the outputs of the system

I do this a lot and it works very well.
