Tonight I was doing quick ruff mixes and I was hearing what sounded exactly like clocking issues. I only heard it once while tracking for five hours. On playback/mixdown it was 5-10 times per song! I switched to internal clock, different clock rate, unplugged the Lucid... no go, kept hearing those annoying clicks. After an hour of rebooting to start the clocking correctly (in all fashions) I decided to start soloing tracks. It turns out to be the bass track 'clicking'. I moved it to another channel on the submix I wanted and the clicking went away. It was on channel 6 this time though?!?

Oddly enough, on playback of the mixes from CD I don't hear any of the clicking! I did mix all the songs with it since they were ruffs to determine which tracks to keep. All the while I was dreading having to tell an 11 piece band to come back on my dime.
