Here's the install instructions:

Installing plugins on windows 98/ME:

Copy the dll and ini files to C:\WINDOWS\SYSTEM\Ensoniq\PlugIns

Installing plugins on Windows XP:

- 1) Copy the dll and ini files to C:\WINDOWS\system32\Ensoniq\PlugIns
- 2) Add the path to the plugins to the system path.

Right click on "My Computer" and select "Properties"

Go to the advanced tab, and click on "Environment Variables"

Find the variable called "Path" in the "System Variables" box and double click on it.
Type a semicolon at the end of the list in the box that appears, and then paste in the path to the plugins folder, like so: XXXXXXXXXXXXXXXX
Click OK, and another OK, and start up PARIS!Jim,
