Haven't tried the Liquid Mix in a xeon system. The boards we use have TI so in theory they should work with the LM.

The boards we have had the best luck with are the Super micro 5100 and 5400 chip set based boards and the Intel D5400XS.
The lintel board ain't cheap works really well.
The 5400 chip set stuff you have to be careful with because of the heat issues with FBDimm ram. The Intel boards lay out helps allot with this because it does not follow the stupid Xeon spec of having the CPUs right next to each other.
It uses a socket 775 setup so you can use the better desktop style heat sinks.

Super micro has a really neat 5100 chip set set board that is Micro ATX!! Works really well.
