At one time, I used an ADAT loop for realtime dumping of 8 tracks (8 insert sends to 8 new tracks, printed). But 3 and 4 never worked. I swapped the EDS card that the MEC was connected to (after swapping out the ADAT card twice) and things were healed. Never bothered to do an exhaustive investigation - just chalked it up to Paris weirdness. Try a different EDS card in the same position on your mobo, connected to the same MEC / ADAT combination. See if that does anything...
