Read this and make a copy for your files in case you need to refer to it someday. Maybe we should all take some of his advice! A corporate Attorney sent the following out to the employees in his company.

1. Do not sign the back of your credit cards. Instead, put "PHOTO ID REQUIRED."

2.. When you are writing checks to pay on your credit card Accounts, DO NOT put the complete account number on the "For" line. Instead, just put the last four numbers. The credit card company knows the rest of the number, and anyone who might be handling your check as it passes through all the check processing channels won't have access to it.

Do both sides of each license, credit card, etc. You will know what you had in your wallet and all of the account numbers and phone numbers to Call and cancel. Keep the photocopy in a safe place. I also carry a Photocopy of my passport when I travel either here or abroad. We've all heard horror stories about fraud that's committed on us in stealing a Name, address, Social Security number, credit cards.

Unfortunately, I, an attorney , have firsthand knowledge because my Wallet was stolen last month. Within a week, the thief(S) ordered an Expensive monthly cell phone package, applied for a VISA credit card, had A credit line approved to buy a Gateway computer, received a PIN number From DMV to change my driving record information online, and more. But here's some critical information to limit the damage in case this happens to you or someone you know:

5.. We have been told we should cancel our credit cards immediately. But the key is having the toll free numbers and your card Numbers handy so you know whom to call. Keep those where you can find them.

6.. File a police report immediately in the jurisdiction where your credit cards, etc., were stolen. This proves to credit Providers you were diligent, and this is a first step toward an Investigation (if there ever is one).

But here's what is perhaps most important of all: (I never even thought to do this.)

7.. Call the 3 national credit reporting organizations Immediately to place a fraud alert on your name and also call the Social Security fraud line number. - 2.) Experian (formerly TRW): 888-397-3742
- 3.) Trans Union : 800-6807289
- 4.) Social Security Administration (fraud line):800-269-0271

In N3 this is the only reason I end up with re-routed I/O - the reason being that your default or project may have a different setup and in order to accommodate regular I/O assignments, external gear is taken offline = Saving your I/O assignments, including CR setup can be a lifesaver, assuming this is the problem you are seeing.
 Do note that the two (VST I/O and the control room config) are separate = and you need to save both, even though they will impact one another = when allocating I/O (if you use the Control Room at least - it is *not* saved with the I/O presets at the moment, though I think it should).
 This is also one feature I would ask for in N4/C4.x - I/O and Control Rooms settings saved with each project, in addition to retaining global preset list/default setting option.
 Hope that solves the problem DJ - I know rerouting is massively frustrating.
