I can't figure out how to dump that Sony worm; I couldn't find it specifically on the Microsoft website, and the download that did claim the ability to find it, didn't.

CPU load still hovering at 50%. If this is useful info at all, I can still hear the CPU "working", even when it should be idle. Something is going on in there, but what?

I have 2 EDS cards, and two of the 512MB RAM sticks. I have had an nVidia video card since building this thing about 2 1/2 years ago.

The CPU load has been like this ever since I first discovered it about six months ago, but could very well have been doing it all along. I didn't think anything of it, until a recent and taxing mix job maxed everything out in PARIS, and I was getting digital clicks and pops, and error messages.

Is there anything I can do to ID the issue at this point? Or do I take it one at a time- replace video card, mess with RAM, etc.?
