Like Dave, I don't need iLife - just an OS, stripped down running fast. iWork might come in handy for only \$79 vs. MS Office since I don't need the full capabilities of Office and do get MS Word and Excel docs from clients, but again, it is an add on, not an OS feature.

Beyond that, I'm not what the context of your question is. Is Apple considering such a move?

No longer an apparent PC-only issue, even though this is an older article. By comparison our Mac updates almost weekly with security updates. I have yet to update PCs I built over a year ago. I do recall viruses being an issue for Macs in the earlier days. Imho, it's best to make direct comparisons - as soon as I get my hands on a Macintel and Nuendo 4 I plan to do plugin/loading tests to see which OS is really faster and more efficient for pro audio use, and price out the parts in a Macintel to see how much the nice case and OSX really cost. I like some aspects of Macs, and am no fan of MS or Windows, but when push comes to shove, much of the propaganda against PCs is unfounded and ill-informed. The rest, MS deserves.
